In this year's Lenten Talks we listen to two voices that speak out to us from the past and two voices that speak out to us today

Tuesday 23 Feb John Henry Newman – his prophetic journey

Dermot Mansfield is an Irish Jesuit, ordained in 1976, who has been mainly involved in retreat work and spiritual direction. He acts as an assistant priest in St Gabriel's parish, Dollymount, Clontarf. His interest in Newman goes back over 50 years. He is the author of 'Heart Speaks to Heart - the Story of Blessed John Henry Newman' which was published in 2010 by Veritas.

Tuesday 1st March Angela Merkel – a voice for justice

Michael Commane is a Dominican teacher and preacher who has lived and worked in Germany. He is also a journalist. He was Press Officer for Concern Worldwide and currently is Press Officer for Young Scientists Tanzania and Dublin's New Theatre. In September he visited refugee camps in northern Lebanon, where Concern is working close to the Syrian border.

Tuesday 8th March My Vision, as a Woman, of Future Church

Mary T. Malone is an historian. She specialises in the history of women in Christianity. She returned to Ireland in 1998 after 35 years in Canada, where she taught at Toronto School of Theology.

The final talk of the series 15th March will take place in Mary Immaculate College, Foundation Building.

Tuesday 15th March Edward Thomas O'Dwyer, Bishop of Limerick 1886-1917- a figure of controversy

Edward O Callaghan is a Franciscan priest who worked in the diocese of Limerick for 25 years. He was involved in Adult Education, directing the course of Nursing Ethics for nurse students, and in historical research. He researched an MA Thesis on Bishop O'Dwyer and completed a doctoral thesis on English Catholics and Irish Home Rule.
